

History

As part of our London topic the children will be learning about 'The Great Fire of London.' The children will find out that in 1666, a huge fire that started in a tiny bakery and burned down most of London - because it was so big, it was called the Great Fire of London. The fire lasted four days, and burned down over 13,000 homes. There are a lot of reasons why the fire was so large, mostly to do with the way houses were built - a lot of them were made from wood, and were very close together. The children will create art work, design Tudor homes in design and technology and learn to create a time line.

Art and Design Technology

In art the children will create paintings by pulling paint up the paper. They will then cut out houses and stick on top. We will also create clay relief houses and newspaper Reports on 2Publish a computer program.

PE

In PE the children will be working on dance and games. They will think carefully about why we warm up and the importance of this.

Geography

As part of our London topic the children will be learning about the capital city of England. The children will look at where London is on a map and compare it to their own locality. They will learn about some of the attractions in London and link this to their knowledge of human and physical features.

Computing

In computing the children will be learning how to research a topic. They will look at a range of search engines and to use them safely. In groups they will create presentations on 'The Great Fire of London' which they will then present to the rest of the class. They will learn how to organise questions on a mind map, cite the sources of information that they are using, add appropriate images and present their findings in a lively way.
